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#### 1. Preamble

M. S. Ramaiah University of Applied Sciences (MSRUAS) is a private University established by an Act passed by the State of Karnataka. The University's operations commenced from 30<sup>th</sup> December 2013 following the issue of Notification No. ED 103 UNE 2013.

The University was formally inaugurated on 18<sup>th</sup> March 2014. MSRUAS is sponsored by Gokula Education Foundation (Medical), a Public Charitable Trust of M. S. Ramaiah family. MSRUAS is a Comprehensive University and Unitary in nature. At the time of formation of the University, the Sponsoring Body, by a Resolution integrated the existing institutions, viz., namely M.S. Ramaiah School of Advanced Studies (1999), M.S. Ramaiah College of Hotel Management (1993), M.S. Ramaiah College of Pharmacy (1992), M.S. Ramaiah Dental College (1991) and the M.S. Ramaiah Advanced Learning Centre (2012) as Faculties of the new University.

M. S. Ramaiah University of Applied Sciences has broadly organised its activities under the following divisions — Academics, Research, Training and Lifelong Learning, Techno Centre and Centre of Transferable Skills and Leadership Development. Academic Operations of the University commenced with effect from academic year 2014 — 15. This includes 7 Faculties comprising 34 Academic Departments, a Directorate for Quality Control, Educational Processes and Educational Technologies and a Directorate for Student Placement, Welfare and Career Advice. Presently the University offers 16 Academic and Doctoral level programmes and 68 Undergraduate and Postgraduate courses. The University has also established separate Directorates for imparting Training, Skills Development and Lifelong Learning programmes and Industrial Research & Consultancy for Industry, Government and other Public and Private Institutions through its Techno Centre.

The University is included in the List of Universities issued by University Grants Commission (UGC). The information requested by UGC in its Proforma for ascertaining UGC norms and standards has been submitted and the dates for UGC Expert Committee to visit the University is expected during the 1<sup>st</sup> quarter of 2016.



#### Vice Chancellor's Message



On 30<sup>th</sup> August 2015, we completed the first academic year of the University. It was indeed a challenging task to familiarize the members of faculty, staff and students and accept **Student Centric Outcome Based Education** - a revolutionary teaching & learning system that we decided to implement in our University. Initially, it was a daunting task to make faculty members unlearn older concepts and learn new concepts of teaching and assessing. Students, for a long time, kept comparing their

efforts with their counterparts in other universities and often expressed the difficulty in coping with the new system. However, without getting disheartened, we at the University persuaded the faculty members and students on the benefits of the new system often inspiring them with many motivational talks. All these efforts paid off when we saw a large number of blogs appearing in digital media, written by our own students, analysing the visible benefits they were deriving by this new method of teaching and learning often comparing their learning experience with their counterparts studying in best universities abroad.

During our first year of operation, we were inundated with several applications for our Research programmes. More than 300 applications were received but only one third of the applicants were admitted. Our faculty members have written more than 75 research proposals to various granting agencies and published nearly 300 research articles in various research journals and conferences. Personally, it gives me lot of happiness when I see highly inspired and motivated members of faculty taking enormous interest not only in teaching but also in pursuing research.

The University has done extraordinary well in the areas of industrial research and consultancy and also in the area of training and lifelong learning. More than 35 consultancy projects were undertaken and we conducted around 50 training courses for corporates, practicing professionals and fresh graduates. The research work resulted in the filing of more than 20 patents in the last academic year.

The Directorates of Student Placement, Welfare and Career Advice (DSPWCA), Transferrable Skills & Leadership Development (DTSLD) and International Collaborations and Partnership Management (DICPM) have created enough opportunities for students to experience and excel in co-curricular and extra-curricular domain.

Equipped with state-of-the-art facilities in the laboratories, libraries and other resource centres the University has created the right environment to provide rich teaching, learning, research and real life problem solving experience to its students as well as to faculty members. Many of the facilities created can be compared to what is available at some of the best universities across the globe.

I believe in the statement "The mind is not a vessel to be filled, but a fire to be kindled." and we strive to *Ignite the Minds* for improving the life of the people of the World and India in particular through our revolutionary education system.


#### Fee Regulation Committee

  - i. Students' feedback is obtained twice a semester. Once during the mid of the semester and other at the end of the semester
  - ii. The Academic Registrar (Faculty) and Manager-Programme Operations are responsible for obtaining the feedback from students and handover the feedback forms to the office of the Head Quality Control (Academics).

#### b. Modular Scheme

i. Students' feedback is obtained at the end of teaching of each module.

ii. The Academic Registrar (Faculty) and Manager-Programme Operations are responsible for obtaining the feedback from students and handover the feedback forms to the office of the Head Quality Control (Academics)

#### 2. Student Feedback Analysis Reports

- a. The feedback analysis report is prepared by Head Quality Control (Academics).
- The midterm/modules student feedback analysis report should be made available to the Dean of the faculty at the time of Staff-student consultative committee meeting to initiate corrective action if any
- c. The complete semester/modules student feedback report should be made available during SAB and PAB to initiate corrective action if any
- d. The student feedback analysis report should also be sent to Chief Quality Control
   (Academics) to present the same during University Performance Review
   Committee meeting

#### 3. Faculty Feedback

- a. The Academic Registrar (Faculty) and Manager-Programme Operations are responsible for obtaining the feedback from faculty members and handover the feedback forms to the office of the Head Quality Control (Academics).
- b. Faculty members who teach a particular subject/module are required to fill a Faculty Feedback form to know what difficulties they faced while delivering a subject/module and about the students they taught.

#### 4. Faculty Feedback Analysis Reports

- a. The Head Quality Control (Academics) analyses the feedback and prepares an analysis report and makes it available during staff student consultative committee meeting, SAB and PAB as well as during the faculty appraisal to initiate corrective action if any by the Faculty Dean.
- b. The faculty feedback analysis report should also be sent to Chief Quality Control (Academics) to present the same during University Performance Review Committee meeting

#### 5. Student Exit Feedback

a. Graduands are required to fill the exit feedback form at the end of the course and hand over it to the Manager – Examination and Assessment

#### 6. Student Exit Feedback Analysis Reports

a. The office of Head Quality Control (Academics) prepares an analysis report and submits it to the Chief - Quality Control

 b. The Chief – Quality Control should present these reports during University Performance Review Committee meeting and also during Academic Programme and Planning Review Committee meetings for appropriate actions

#### **Programme Quality Assessment Committee**

- 1. The committee assesses the quality index of all Faculties, Departments, Programmes, Courses offered considering teaching, learning, student experience, brand value and value for money.
- 2. The committee obtains feedback from Students, Academic Faculty, Non-Academic Faculty, Parents of the Students, Alumni, and Employers of the Students at the end of each academic year. The feedback data is entered into a quality index computing software for the determination of quality index
- 3. The committee members are Head QCs of all Faculties and Chief QC is the chair of the committee, one of the Head QCs will act as secretary of the committee on a rotation basis. Other members of the committee are nominated by the respective Deans from each department or Faculty on an annual basis.
- 4. The committee submits the report to University Performance Review Committee for action

#### **Proctoral System**

The University has implemented the Proctoral System to guide the students periodically on registration for credits, their studies, review of attendance and performance, reporting the attendance and performance to the parents. The University ensures that there is at least one Proctor for every 20 Undergraduate students.




Figure shows a glimpse of teaching material uploaded in University Portal

- 2. Faculty members themselves are given the Student Feedback forms for them to analyze and develop methods to improve their teaching.
- 3. The University will consider student feedback scores for the annual appraisal of the faculty members.

#### Subject Assessment Board (SAB)

The Subject Assessment Board is responsible for reviewing the standard of assessment and its comparability across subjects. The SAB is scheduled to meet at the end of each semester to review the assessed work for each subject. The Board objectively examines the subject delivery, examination and evaluation processes to ensure academic standards based on data compiled for the semester are met. The Subject Assessment Board is tasked with confirming the subject or module marks after completing its review. Once the marks have been confirmed by SAB the marks cannot be subsequently altered by any other board, unless an error in transcription or an omission is discovered. SAB meetings are chaired by the Dean of the concerned Faculty. The Heads of Departments, Internal and External Examiners and an Observer nominated by the Vice Chancellor are the other members of SAB. SABs have been constituted by the University for the academic year 2014-15.

Mr. Bhagvanji M. Sonagra had worked on the project "Eye Tracking Gadget for User Research" during his Postgraduate studies.




