
#### Impact Analysis in the Teaching - Learning process


- Introduction of fellowship courses for MBBS students at Ramaiah Medical College. NMC approved the fellowships as proposed by RMC. The eligibility and topics offered are formulated
- Inclusion of Engineering Economics for Aerospace Engineering and Automotive Engineering. The PS and CS for the same has been designed and approval got from ACM, BOM.
- Centre for Professional Development and training has been started to facilitate development of various professional activities for faculty and staff. The Center is established for the conduction of Faculty development programs and workshops that benefits the teaching and non-teaching staff at RUAS.
- Establishment of Language labs. Language labs teach communication skills to all students irrespective of their professional training. Introduction of Yoga and Sports courses as value-based courses. Curriculum for both the courses and the sessions have started.
- Implementation status of NEP-conduction of FDP programs and training sessions on various components of NEP. Faculty members are trained on various components of NEP, to implement in every aspect of academics. NEP implementation undertaken for all the B. Tech. programs from 2023-24. The NEP pattern curriculum for all the courses in B. tech. programs are being designed.
- Introduction of a policy for change of branch from one program to another. A committee has been constituted to look in to and frame a policy for change of branch from one program to another.
- Introduction of Digital Valuation. The examination department implemented digital valuation in association with Logisys.
- NPTEL/ MOOC/ SWAYAM courses of various faculties. The various NPTEL/ MOOC/ SWAYAM courses are offered to the students. A faculty coordinator has been identified from each faculty to coordinate the student activities related to online courses.
- Fellowship in Onco-Pharmacy by RMC and FPH. The program duration, intake, stipend offered etc., has been defined.
- Forensic Odontology, Micro Restorative and Micro endodontic, and Special care dentistry courses are introduced. The course curriculum and other details of the courses have been defined.

### Impact Analysis in Infrastructure (ICT and Learning Resources)

- To offer One-click, desktop, laptop, or mobile friendly portal to access the entire range of e-services offered by the University any-time, any-place. Promotes transparency and accountability in its services to all the stakeholders.
- Adoption of emerging digital technologies in enhancing the process of teaching and learning.

- Created Infrastructure for Lecture Capturing System LCS and effective usage of the same. E-service, ERP Juno all modules are implemented.

#### Impact Analysis in Student Support Systems

- A student while pursuing his/her education in the University requires various facilities and opportunities to stimulate the emotional and aesthetic wellbeing and to kindle the intellectual and cognitive development. With this noble objective, Ramaiah University of Applied Sciences created Directorate of Student Affairs (DSA) to facilitate and assist students' diverse needs by providing innovative extra-curricular experiences that augment well-being, nurture life and academic skill development, create responsibility and cultivate leadership competence.
- MSRUAS provide services and programs to develop the professional skills and to create an exciting learning community where a student can grow and succeed.
- Inter faculty competitions for students in basketball, volleyball, football, cricket for boys, throw ball for girls and shuttle badminton for both boys and girls, chess and caroms were held.
- The mandatory Service to Society for 2nd year UG and 1st year PG students was undertaken after a gap of 2 years because of the pandemic. 42 teams consisting of an average of 35 students per team and one faculty coordinator undertook social service activities. The total number of students involved in the various activities was around 1400.
- Activities ranged from visiting old age homes, orphanages, shelter homes, women's ashram, school for special needs children to make a difference in their lives for one day at least by entertaining them, lending an ear to their tales of struggles and tragedies and to donate some basic needs like groceries, clothing etc, visiting government schools to create awareness on importance of higher education,
- various opportunities available in different fields, donating stationery items to the students, organizing health and dental camps, distribution of hygiene kits in rural areas, cleaning of public places and painting of parks, tree plantation, creating awareness on environmental issues like ill effects of use of plastics, waste segregation and personal hygiene to general public
- Rotafest It was a chance for Rotaractors of all ages to make the best use of the platform and showcase their talents and create wonderful memories.
- The Director of International Services for Rotaract MSRUAS, a student belonging to the Department of Food Technology, collaborated with the Rotaract Club of Boston to orchestrate a captivating virtual cultural exchange event, Culture Connect.
